		Cillian Flynn (CF) then addressed the Plenary, speaking about LPPN's involvement, the public consultation process and his focus on social inclusion in the IAG discussions.			
		Following the presentations, there was discussion with a number of questions. The feedback from those at the meeting was that the presentations and discussion were very informative and the general feeling was one of anticipation to see the Government decision and the ensuing legislation next year. CF's statements of outcomes can be found on the PPN website.			
5.	Progress and Financial reports for 2020	JB gave an overview of the Secretariat's report to the Plenary (the report was circulated in advance of the meeting and is at the end of the minutes).  In his presentation, JB referred to the priorities agreed by Plenary in 2019 and the progress made in 2020. He went on to summarise the proposed priorities for 2021 – which include the strengthening of the Linkage Groups, which he said are the key structure to facilitate full and meaningful public participation within and through the PPN.

- d) 10 working days allows reasonable time for volunteers and community representatives to consider LCCC committees' deliberations
- e) There a balancing for the LG's in terms of if they have the agenda, they cannot propose items to include on it and if they do not have the agenda, they cannot discuss what is coming up at the next LCCC committee meeting
- f) The Salesforce Chatter facility provides a useful and transparent way for PPN representatives and LG members to discuss possible LCCC committee meeting agenda items in between LG meetings. Additionally, the AOB agenda item for LCCC committee meetings provides some scope for inclusion of new items as agreed by the LG

#### **Achievements**

### Membership

Currently there are 132 members. Breakdown of membership is:

#### Secretariat

A new Secretariat was elected at the Plenary on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2019. It continues to function well and is meeting regularly with 16 meetings since being elected. We are greatly indebted to the support provided by Mary Casey, Mo Foley Walsh and Seamus O'Connor. Three Secretariat members resigned. Elections for replacements opened in October 2020 – no nominations were received.

#### Constitution

The PPN constitution was ratified by the Plenary in February 2020 giving clarity on how the PPN should operate. In view of 1) the recent publication by Government of the new Handbook for PPNs and 2) Limerick PPN's experiences of electing and supporting representatives onto local structures, the Secretariat recommends a review of the constitution take place in early 2021 where the Plenary will review, discuss and potentially make changes to the current constitution.



### **2019 Annual Report**

The 2019 Annual Report was prepared by the Secretariat and shared with PPN members and the Department of Rural and Community Development (DRCD). Its content is included in the national PPN annual report which was published by the DRCD in November 2020. The Limerick PPN annual report gives a clear baseline to show where Limerick PPN is coming from and gives a direction on what needs to be done going forward. It is on the website.

# Nomination to the Implementation Advisory Group (IAG) for the Directly Elected Mayor

At the request of the Department of Housing, Planning and Local Government in November 2019, a representative was elected by the Plenary in February 2020 onto the IAG. In the absence of an agreed constitution, the Secretariat acted as a Linkage Group. The IAG has now completed its business and the Plenary members will be updated on this under a separate meeting agenda item.

## **Nomination and Election of PPN Representatives to Local Structures**

Following the election to the DEM IAG and the adoption of the PPN constitution, elections to Council committees commenced in February 2020. Due to the Covid pandemic, the successful nominees in these elections were not ratified by Limerick City and County Council until its deferred meeting in late June 2020. Three further rounds of PPN elections were held in July, September and October. These were facilitated by having access to Limerick City and County Council's MyPoint platform – giving the PPN a secure platform for online elections to take place. A fourth election took place in November for two seats on a new group for the URBACT Health and Greenspace project. One of these seats was filled. The current breakdown of the representation across the various Council committees is as follows:

### **Linkage Groups**

- a) Eight linkage groups have been established to support the PPN representatives on the various committees and discuss matters relevant to their respective committees.
- b) An online communication space (Salesforce Chatter) for each of the Linkage Groups has been established, meaning that members can communicate directly in a secure and transparent manner.
- c) All but one Linkage Group have met online at least once this year. These meetings have initially been supported by Secretariat members. In future, it is anticipated that Linkage Groups will be self-managing.
- d) Statements of Outcomes from Council committee meetings have generally been prepared by the PPN representatives on all the external committees. These are jointly-prepared between the representatives on a given committee and then communicated directly with the Linkage Group members via Chatter. The agreed Statements of Outcomes are also published on the website on their respective Linkage Group pages.
- e) Where Linkage Groups have access to both the PPN representatives' Statement(s) of Outcomes and Council committee meeting documentation, the Linkage Group meetings are particularly productive.
- f) Based on experience to date, the Secretariat recommends the Plenary adopt a standard terms of reference for all PPN Linkage Groups for all Linkage Group meetings.
- g) Overview of Linkage Group meetings which started in October 2020:
  - 1. Travel and Transportation Linkage Group:
    - i. Met three times
    - ii. At first meeting: presentation by the SPC meetings administrator from the Council
    - iii. Prepared and made a submission on the Limerick Shannon Metropolitan Area Transport Strategy (LSMATS)
    - iv. Discussed a presentation made by one of the PPN members on the Schoolgate Project which was on an upcoming SPC meeting
    - v. A member of the group will facilitate the next Linkage Group meeting in 2021
  - 2. Economic Development, Enterprise and Planning Linkage Group:
    - i. Met twice
    - ii. At first meeting: presentation by the SPC meetings administrator from the Council
    - iii. The four PPN representatives on this SPC have been making direct contact with Linkage Group members to encourage and facilitate engagement in the discussions around what is being discussed by the SPC
    - iv. There have been robust discussions and significant sharing of information at both meetings
    - v. The four representatives will initially rotate the role of Facilitator of the Linkage Group in 2021
  - 3. Climate Action, Biodiversity and Environment Linkage Group:
    - i. Met once
    - ii. At first meeting: presentation by the SPC meetings administrator from the Council
    - iii. The representatives on this SPC are actively sharing information and receiving feedback from Linkage Group members on Chatter on items relating to the SPC meeting agendas
  - 4. Community, Leisure and Culture Linkage Group:
    - i. Met once



- ii. At first meeting: presentation by the SPC meetings administrator from the Council
- iii. All seven PPN seats on this SPC are now filled and the PPN representatives have all attended at least 1 SPC meeting
- iv. Agreed to make recommendation for consideration by Plenary to have Council committee meetings' documentation enough in time to facilitate meaningful discussion within the Linkage Group
- v. One of the PPN representatives will facilitate the next Linkage Group meeting in 2021
- 5. Home and Social Development Linkage Group:
  - i. Met once
  - ii. Webinar held in September with Limerick City and County Council Director of Service to explain this SPC
  - iii. There was a robust discussion about the Regeneration Programme which helped inform the PPN representatives before an SPC meeting
  - iv. The three PPN representatives on the SPC (2 seats on the SPC remain vacant) will initially rotate the role of Facilitator of the Linkage Group in 2021

#### **Covid response**

- 1) Limerick PPN has maintained a dedicated section on its website with links to reliable information and resources in response to the pandemic. - 4. Public Sector Duty training for PPN members (with Community Law and Mediation)
- 5. Working with Social Justice Ireland, Department of Rural and Community Development, Limerick City and County Council, national Environmental Pillar and other relevant partners to help PPN members have access to capacity-building opportunities that may present over the year and that are relevant to the role and functions of the PPN

## Information sharing and communication

- 1. Continue to keep the PPN Twitter and Facebook pages and website up to date
- 2. Ongoing publication and sharing of FundingPoint (done with Limerick City and County Council and The Wheel)
- 3. Continued use of Zoom professional package to support the PPN Secretariat and membership
- 4. Working with DRCD in the planned national communications plan for PPNs
- 5. Ongoing sharing of information on opportunities relevant to PPN members through social media and through Salesforce Chatter

# **Development of a Community Wellbeing Statement for Limerick PPN**

A wellbeing statement looks at what is required for the wellbeing of individuals and communities, now and for the generations to come.*

- PPN it will need to reregister after 24 months membership, but if the Annual General Plenary Meeting in that year is before the 24 months membership is reached, reregistration needs to be done before this meeting.)
- 5. Ongoing engagement of two full-time support staff employed by Limerick City and County Council
- 6. Completion of the 2020 annual report
- 7. 2020 Memorandum of Understanding with Limerick City and County Council
