Overview of Crime statistics	<p>Crime Statistics were presented by Senior Analyst, Ms. Collins. Chief Superintendent also made substantial contributions.</p> <p>Three main points:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Domestic abuse is up; 2 specially trained gardai have now been assigned to liaise with people who have experienced domestic abuse to bring the rate down and gain more convictions.</li> <li>2. Property crime was down but has tended to move out into the country areas as access to town houses is difficult due to lock down and more residents being at home.</li> </ol>

Re number of files referred to the DPP along with fines and prosecutions initiated: 28 breaches, no fines, 13 to prosecute, 3 not to, 5 awaiting direction and 7 preparing file</li> <li>2. Re dedicated Policing Plan for Rathkeale during the Christmas Period: this cannot be disclosed due to operational reasons.</li> <li>3. Re policing operation in Garryowen area: There has been an operation in place to tackle antisocial behaviour in this area – it was agreed at the end of November to run this operation for a further 3 weeks when it will again be reviewed; operation entailed high visible patrols and check points at high-risk times.</li> <li>4. RE number of drug cases remaining before the courts: Presently there are 26 cases before the courts under section 15 A of the Misuse of Drugs act1977/84</li> <li>5. Re will Garda Management increase its operation in the Johnsgate Village estate as Anti-Social Behaviour has been highlighted: Garda are aware of the issue and are liaising with LCCC in relation to decisions surrounding housing in that area; an Operational Order has been created to ensure additional check points and patrols like the operation in Garryowen</li> <li>6. Re update for Covid 19 related vandalism and graffiti in Limerick: There is no Covid 19 related MO recorded for Criminal Damage; there was one incident that had an overt link to Covid 19 reported during November 2020 and this incident is under investigation.</li> </ol>
