2.	Presentation on Energy Emissions Balance for Limerick. Question submitted by Michelle Hayes	Pat Stephens, Limerick Clare Energy Agency gave a general overview on Green House gas emissions and the Emissions trading scheme. A report had been commissioned from ARUP Engineering. Ireland's targets 51% reduction by 2030 to achieve this we would have to reduce emissions by 0.85% CO2.	Michelle Hayes – raised concerns and deficiencies in the Arup report regarding Data Centres. Michelle made reference to the proposed Data Centres for Ennis. The predicted load of the data centre is 200Mw is equivalent to consumption by 210,000 homes.
3. Question by Michelle Hayes	 Could the Council provide an update in relation to changes in recycling in Mungret. I understand some recycling is now transferred to a Dublin based company, Panda, which has been awarded the contract and involves transport to Dublin. A. (1) What are the reasons for the change in contract. (ii) Has there been any analysis of Carbon Footprint arising from this change. B. In relation to consumables such as printer toner cartridges, would the Council consider a facility to recycle these having regard to the reuse, repair, recycle aspirations of the Circular Economy. 	Reply to Question: The contract for the operation of the Recycling Centres in Limerick ceased at the end of 2018, resulting in the Council having to retender for a new contract. The new contract was awarded to Panda who are responsible for operating the Civic Amenity Sites in Mungret, Newcastle West and Killmallock. The Mungret CAS has been providing a service whereby the public were encouraged to avail of compost recycled from green waste that was being collected adjacent to the Civic Amenity Site. This service had been temporarily suspended due to the
