# 1. Community & Voluntary KILMURRY ARTS AND HERITAGE CENTRE

## No.2 Heritage



#### **Limerick Civic Trust**

Limerick Civic Trust will be your Host in this two part Excursion in the Georgian Quarter of Limerick. You will be visiting the Peoples Museum of Limerick and will also be taken on a guided tour of the historic Georgian Quarter.



The People's Museum of Limerick, at No. 2 Pery Square, Limerick is managed by Limerick Civic Trust. Limerick Civic Trust have a long relationship with this building, having first carried out its restoration from 1996 to 1999. The building was opened as 'The Georgian House and Garden' by President Mary McAleese in 1999.

Limerick's distinctive Georgian Quarter features many fine examples of eighteenth and nineteenth century architecture. This tour examines diverse styles ranging from Victorian, Gothic and Hiberno Romaneque.

## People's Park Soundwalk



Being outdoors is ever-more important to us. Sounds from nature, blue and green spaces (e.g. birds singing, rustling leaves, a flowing river) are known to reduce stress and have a positive impact on our health and well-being. However, in a world of hustle and bustle our cities are becoming noisier and the need for peace and tranquillity for our citizens can be overlooked.

One of the aims of the Environmental Noise Directive is for action planning authorities to protect areas which are desirably quiet, or which offer a sense of tranquillity, through a process of identification and validation followed by formal designation of "Quiet Areas".

Limerick City and County Council has identified a number of candidate Quiet Areas which it is undertaking investigations by surveying the acoustic (sound) environment and correlating measurements with visitors perceived experiences. By taking into account citizens views is an opportunity for inclusion in local government decision-making.



## Workshops

#### 1. Wellbeing of Staff & Volunteers in the PPNs: Cavan PPN



This workshop is hosted by CavanPPN Coordinator Daniel Downey. With ten years experience as a staff member, he has gained valuable insight into the morale, wellbeing and positivity of those engaging in our PPNs. The workshop will focus both on the 'how' of Wellbeing and how to maximise it and minimise burnout and demoralization. But also the 'why' of Wellbeing in its dynamic way of giving a little to get a lot more from happy, healthy and cared for volunteers and staff.

#### 2. Community Energy Charter: A First in Ireland: Offaly PPN

Offaly PPN membership identified the need to establish a series of collectively agreed guidelines to enable them to meet energy developments from a position of strength and informed opinion. This came about in light of the number of Wind & Solar Farms appearing all across the county. Members felt the need to have input. The resulting Community Energy Charter is a perfect example of the potential in the PPN representative mechanism, outlining the community position across a spectrum of themes arising from the energy transition in Offaly.

The Assembly is a collaboration between the University, Limerick City and County Council, Limerick Public Participation Network (PPN) and Limerick Comhairle na nÓg, supported by the Limerick Community Education Network (LCEN) and designed to provide a platform for further engagement between UL and community.
