Survey Marks in Limerick

"There are some avid benchmark hobbyists in Ireland, and we want to draw on their interest and that of other community groups."

Researchers at UL are calling on the local community to get involved in a project aimed at locating and recording an important Irish heritage relic via a newly launched app.

Bench marks also known as Crow's Feet, Sapper's marks and Devil's marks are present in our rural and urban landscapes for almost two hundred years. These carvings which are part of our heritage have no legal protection and are disappearing through destruction, renovations work and are being lost to nature. The Nature Restoration Law (NRL) was enacted across the EU in July 2024 with the goal of restoring degraded ecosystems. Ireland is now in the process of figuring out how to apply the new law.

Join this Webinar to hear from Fintan Kelly, Agriculture and Land Use Policy and Advocacy Officer at the Irish Environmental Network. Fintan has been working closely on the NRL over the past few years and has great insight into what stage it is at here in Ireland and where it is going.

He will introduce the NRL, explaining what it is, what the timelines are and how the Irish Government plan to engage with stakeholders. This webinar will be a perfect introduction to the law and the current plans in Ireland.

The HSE has developed a Free, easy-to-access online programme called 'Balancing Stress' to support people across Ireland in managing common mental health difficulties including stress, anxiety and low mood.

The Balancing Stress programme offers six online video sessions (each around 35 minutes) covering key topics including managing stress, worry, anxiety, low mood, and relationship stress. This online programme offers people evidence-based tools to manage stress effectively and enhance their mental wellbeing.

The programme is delivered by Dr Niamh Clarke, HSE Principal Psychologist, and features expert interviews with Professor Alan Carr, UCD School of Clinical Psychology.

You can watch the videos at your own pace, on your own time, using a phone, tablet or laptop.
